

President University's APAC Undergraduate Scholarships

President University, in Indonesia, offers a variety of undergraduate scholarships and awards in recognition of outstanding academic achievements, leadership qualities, and special sports talents.

The President University's APAC undergraduate scholarships are freshmen scholarships aim to provide opportunities to identify and support young outstanding people of APAC Citizen students who demonstrate academic excellence, high intellectual capacity, sound character, strong leadership potential, and a passion for creativity and innovation, as well as be part of the APAC community studying in Indonesia and its socio-culture.

Candidates will be considered and shortlisted for the scholarship through their applications for undergraduate admission to President University. This is an annual program that supports university's objectives to be the world class university that produces leaders in their field and communities. The President University's APAC undergraduate scholarships are open for applications in the Asia Pacific countries ie. China, Hongkong, Mongolia, Japan, Korea, Taiwan, India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, PNG, Australia, New Zealand.

Eligibility Criteria

All candidates must:

- 1. Be citizens of an APAC member country.
- 2. Have strong leadership qualities and potential
- 3. Present good co-curricular activities record
- 4. Possess outstanding results that completed High-School [12 years], A level 1B Diploma or equivalent.
- 5. Pass a President University entrance examination [placement test].

Scholarship Benefit

A. Non-subsidized students: Not receiving undergraduate scholarship

The undergraduate annual full payable fee policy, comprising (1) Tuition fee and (2) Cost of living. The annual tuition fee is fixed for the duration of the degree program.

Students who receive APAC undergraduate scholarship award are required to pay only total annual living cost of USD 3.500, - deposit guaranteed for first year annual fees to the admission. The annual costs below have been derived based on a conservative estimate for a reasonably comfortable lifestyle to cover as follow:

- On-campus accommodation (twin sharing occupancy),
- 2. Pre-university course program at the first year,
- 3. A new student orientation program at the first year,
- 4. TOEIC, test of English of international communication,
- Laboratory, workshop and library
- 6. Final examination, remedial or retake (if any),
- 7. Student club and communities program,
- Medical insurance and student visa renewal.

For international students to become fully involved in the President University community, it is policy that undergraduate students must live in university on-campus accommodation (student dormitory).

The scholar must sustain his/her excellent academic record to be considered for the award. The scholarship will be monitored and renewed every year provided the scholar maintains a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of at least 3.5 (or equivalent) and good conduct. The scholars who cannot meet the CGPA requirement will be suspended and fine from the scholarship.

Terms and Conditions

- 1. To qualify for the scholarships, candidates should be citizens of the APAC member countries.
- If you are sitting for the senior high school final examination and results will be available after closing date, please put 'The senior high school final examination after closing date' in the application form.
- Recipients of the scholarship (scholars) may not concurrently hold any other scholarship, fellowship, bursary, grant, award or allowance without prior approval from the University.
- 4. President University does not guarantee and/or provide scholars with employment upon graduation.
- If the scholar decides to withdraw from President University and/or terminate the scholarship prematurely, President University reserves the right to impose repayment of all scholarship fund disbursed to scholar.

Application and Shortlisting Process

- Applicants will be assessed on their suitability for the scholarship, based on the strength of their applications and/or their performance in the scholarship selection interview(s).
- 2. Applicants shortlisted for the selection interview(s) will be informed via e-mail.
- President University reserves the right not to award any scholarship if there are no candidates of sufficient merit. Decision of selection committee is final. Enquiries surrounding its decisions will not be entertained.

All applicant should completed at least 12 years of general education by July of the year of application.

List of supporting documents required:

- A copy of the pages of your passport stating your full names, date and place of birth and expiration date of passport. Passport must be valid for a minimum of 2 [two] years from the date of application.
- 2. A copy of your original senior high school certificate in the original language
- 3. A copy of your final transcript (list of grades/marks) in the original language
- 4. 2 [two] recent Passport-sized photograph
- 5. An English test score report e.g. IELTS, TOEFL, AP, ACT etc.
- 6. Medical report(s) if you have or had any illnesses or disabilities (if applicable)

All non-English supporting documents must be accompanied by an English translation. All applicants are required to translate Prizes/Awards, extra-curricular activities record before submission of documents.

All applicants are encouraged not to submit original certificates and documents. The Office of Admissions will not be held responsible for the damage or loss of original certificates submitted.
